Resolutions at 2018 National Convention

The following Resolutions submitted at the 2018 National Convention were approved and adopted. If a Resolution is not on this listing, it means it was defeated. The additional suggested changes to the Bylaws by the Resolutions committee was tabled to the next National Convention..

- 1. Realign of the National C of A seats. Adopted. Michigan will now have their own seat on the Council. At our June Convention (2019), we will elect a National Council of Administration who will serve a 3-year term (2019-2022). At Department Convention in 2022, we will again elect a National Council of Administration that will serve for two years and we will then elect every two years (even numbered year; ie 2022, 2024, etc.).
- 2. An optional cap of Marine Blue with yellow piping was approved. For those wishing to wear caps, they will be available through the VFW Store (availability date is not known). In addition, pins may be worn on the caps. Caps may be worn with or without the blue shirt.
- 3. Official look is to be worn at National Convention business sessions by Officers, Ambassadors and National District Council members.
- 4. Proof of eligibility no longer needed for any type of transfer, but must show a current year paid or life member card.
- 5. Switch from Demeters to Roberts Rules.

The second reporting quarter ends October 31st. It is MOST important that you look at your guide sheet. You need to be reporting on the achievements listed. The only way we can know how many veterans you have helped, what you did for them, etc. is in the reporting. Sending in a report that states "I missed the meeting, I am sure they read the bulletin" has nothing to do with the achievements. I can't give any credit, check it off or give recognition. Everything you do for a veteran is reportable. Year after year we quote numbers, which are great, but this year they want to recognize the outstanding work that goes into those numbers.

Our National Ambassador wants to share with you "it doesn't matter how small or large, how much money they spend or didn't spend, how many hours the project took or didn't take, EVERY PROJECT counts" and that is what she needs to hear about.-"One Auxiliary, one project, one committee, one member. And that is worth reporting."

The National Veterans Service (NVS)-Service members and veterans may be entitled to benefits from the VA (Department of Veterans Affairs). These benefits include: Disability compensation, Rehabilitation and education programs, including GI benefits. Pension and death benefits and employment and training programs. To make a claim is quite complicated. The NVS has a network of VFW Service Officers to assist veterans with this at NO charge to the veteran. Each year the VFW has helped to recover billions in earned benefits and compensation for our veterans. Have or sponsor a project to support the NVS, as the funds and donations you send in fund these Service Officers. Have your nearest or Post Service Officer information posted or advertised.

November is Military Family Appreciation Month. This month is for recognizing the military families, because they know what it means to serve our country, as they serve too. They know the risks while standing by during long deployments. The spouse left behind holds the family together and celebrates the short time they have while on leave. When the tour of duty has ended, they have to adjust to civilian life and support their veteran.

Begin planning events that can help and celebrate our military families. A few ideas: Volunteer your time. Give them a break by helping with grocery shopping, watching the children allowing them to go to a movie. Leave a "care package", items you know they can use, on their doorstep. Find out what they need like their grass mowed or walk their fur baby. Give them a grocery gift card or certificate to a local restaurant. Have an appreciation dinner or lunch at your Post. Maybe all they need is someone to talk to. The possibilities are endless. Honor their commitment to their support of our country.

Provide direct aid to veterans, military and/or their families. All projects that aid and support our veterans and troops, like sending care packages, holiday parties, funeral dinners, providing transportation to doctor appointments, making their meals etc. is aiding our veterans.

It is important for you to report how many veterans you helped, value of your donation or money you spent. Report the miles each member drove. For example: if you had a funeral luncheon and 10 members helped, find out the total mileage from each member, add it up and report it. If each one made a dish to pass, value of what it cost, for each member, add it up. How many hours each member spent preparing and serving, add it up and report it. You are doing fantastic things for our veterans, so report everything that everybody did.

Some of you have donated furniture, clothing and household items. Many have asked for a standard donation value sheet. We do not have one. You can use one from the IRS or Goodwill if you want to. It is best to use your own judgement. Keep in mind what you would pay for it if you needed to buy it.

Purchase or sell President Sandy's Program Pin. We need to sell out these pins! All funds will go to support Veterans & Family Support. If you need more pins, contact Ruth Barnhill (aka: Raffle Ruthie).

Look over your guide sheet and see what you have done and what you can accomplish. Helpful information on this program can be found at www.vfwauxiliary.org. Go to Veterans & Family Support and click on any link you are interested in. Read through the National Auxiliary Program Book. You can also get more information at the VFW's website: www.vfw.org.

Chairmen attend your District meeting. Great information will be at the School of Instruction at your District meeting. When you attend, make sure the information makes it back to your auxiliary. When you attend your next auxiliary meeting, pass around a sheet of paper, so each member can list what they have done so you can report it.

Fall Conference will be September 26-30th at Boyne Highlands. I look forward to seeing you there. As the VFW and Auxiliary are a family, it is great to get together with family members, visit and share ideas.

School is back in session and that means NOW is the time to head to the schools to get started promoting the Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Award. The contest recognizes three exceptional teachers for their outstanding commitment to teaching Americanism and Patriotism to their students. Each year a classroom elementary, junior high and high school teacher whose curriculum focuses on citizenship education topics – for at least half of the school day in a classroom environment can be nominated for the Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Award. Work with your VFW Post, EVERYTHING you need to know to get started and be successful can be found on the VFW Website: www.vfw.org/TeacheroftheYear/.

Deadlines October 31st - Deadline for teacher nominations at the Post. Post judging should be completed by November 15th and winners sent to District. District judging should be completed by December 15th and winners forwarded to the Department. Department judging should be completed January 10th and winners submitted to VFW National Headquarters by January 15th. Post chairmen must be sure to send the original nomination form, essay and official VFW Post teacher entry form of the winner from each grade's category level — along with one-page resume, up to five pages of documentation and a good quality head and shoulders photograph from the winning teachers.

National Winners will receive:

- A \$1000 award for professional development expenses
- A \$1000 award for his/her school
- Two Award plaques; one for the teacher and the other for his/her school
- An all-expense paid trip to attend a VFW Conference to receive their award

Upcoming Patriotic Holidays:

Patriot Day - September 11

Patriot Day, also known as the national Day of Service and Remembrance, occurs on September 11 each year in memory of those killed during the September 11, 2001, terrorist attacks. Those we lost September 11, 2001 will forever hold a cherished place in our hearts and in the history of our nation. Appropriate ceremonies and activities include a moment of silence beginning at 8:46 a.m. EDT, remembrance services and candlelight vigils. Flags should be flown at half-staff on Patriot Day.

POW/MIA Recognition Day - September 21

POW/MIA Recognition Day honors the commitments and the sacrifices made by our nation's prisoners of war and those who are still missing in action. National POW/MIA Recognition Day is one of the six days specified by law on which the black POW/MIA flag shall be flown over federal facilities and cemeteries, post offices and military facilities. Plan ahead and check with your local facilities to make sure they have a POW/MIA flag and if not, it would be a great time to make a formal presentation of the flag to the facility. POW/MIA – YOU ARE NOT FORGOTTEN.

Gold Star Mother's/Family's Day - September 29

Gold Star Mother's/Family's Day honors mothers and families who have lost a service member in combat. The name comes from the custom of families hanging Service Flags in the window of their homes. The Service Flag has a star for each family member in the armed forces. A blue star represents a family member in active service, a silver star represents a family member wounded or injured in a war zone and a gold star represents a family member killed during active-duty and stands for sacrifice made for honor and freedom. Americans are encouraged to display the Flag and hold appropriate ceremonies as a public expression of our nation's gratitude and respect for our Gold Star Mothers and Families.

Remember to REPORT all that you do! 2nd Quarter is August 1 – October 31st

When submitting your reports PLEASE provide detailed information. Especially how many U.S. or POW MIA flags you handed out, and the number of certificates presented to businesses or citizens in recognition of displaying their U.S. or POW MIA Flag.

NEWS FLASH!!!! - Reporting the Number of Hospital Volunteers

I recently received clarification from National on how you should count any auxiliary volunteer at VA facilities or regular hospitals, retirement homes, hospices, veterans' homes, etc.

A volunteer is always only <u>ONE VOLUNTEER</u>. It doesn't matter how many times or places they volunteer; they are still just one person and should only be counted once for the entire year. If it is easier, you can keep a running list and wait until the end of the reporting year to give me the cumulative total count of volunteers (MEMBERS field in our Reporting System) from all volunteering and projects.

COMMUNITY VOLUNTEER RECRUITMENT WEEK #1 (NOVEMBER 5 – 11, 2018)

The Hospital Volunteer Recruitment Kit is available on the National (www.vfwauxiliary.org/resources) and Department (www.vfwauxmi.org) websites. The kit includes advertising tools (posters, sample announcements, etc.), the official Member Report Form and guidelines for National awards.

- 1) For a successful event, organize a committee and set a date, time and place. Use email, newspapers, TV, posters, and social media to publicize your event. Remember you will need auxiliary members to help set up and man your booth.
- Contact local hospitals and nursing/rehabilitation facilities to gather information on their opportunities, training and need for volunteers.

- Requesting a copy of their volunteer application and have them available at your booth.
- 3) Contact local youth groups like Scouts, local businesses and churches. Give them a flyer or poster that explains the VFW Auxiliary volunteer story.

The second Recruitment week is April 7-13, 2019. Document lessons learned from the November event so your April event can be even better.

National needs to know the number of NEW adult and NEW Youth volunteers. These can be one-time, occasional or regularly scheduled volunteers. In the Description Field on your Quarterly Report, please include separate counts of new adult and youth volunteers your auxiliary recruited.

REPORTING TIPS

- 1) Every time you present a report or read from the Hospital bulletin at an auxiliary meeting is considered one project and should be reported on every one of your quarterly reports.
- 2) Report the number of miles related to hospital projects on your quarterly reports. Do not include a monetary amount for mileage in the VALUE field.
- 3) Only greeting cards sent to hospitalized Veterans and their family members or those in a nursing home/rehab center are reportable under Hospital.
- 4) Each day a member volunteers at a hospital or nursing home/rehab center is one project. Including a timeframe or the actual dates that they volunteered, will help you keep track of what has already been reported.
- 5) If you forget to report a project completed in one quarter, report it for the next quarter.
- 6) For proper credit, report the actual or estimated value of items donated. If the value is not specified but the count is reported, I use an average of \$50 value for a lap robe and \$75 for a quilt.

Legislative Chairman, let's be "Team Believe" because "United We Stand" because we "Believe....We Can Do It" for our Veterans.

ALWAYS PROMOTE THE LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM GOALS: *Priority Goals *VFW Action Corps Weekly *Student Legislative Education *Community Legislative Engagement

Is every chairman getting familiar with "I'm just a bill" on Capitol Hill and trying to "make him a law some day"? Have you picked a Veterans bill to Follow? - how is it doing in the Legislature?: Follow a bill through its stages of the legislative process at www.thomas.gov Report how it's doing at your next meeting. Go to the VFW website (vfw.org under Legislative priorities) and find out more about these items & report on them at your auxiliary meeting — I believe YOU can do it!:

H.R. 2787, Veterans-Specific Education for Tomorrow's Medical Doctors Act or the VET MD Act

H.R. 3696, Wounded Warrior Workforce Enhancement Act

H.R. 5521, VA Hiring Enhancement Act

H.R. 5693, Long-Term Care Veterans Choice Act

H.R. 5864, VA Hospitals Establishing Leadership Performance Act

H.R. 5938, Veterans Serving Veterans Act of 2018

H.R. 5974, Department of Veterans Affairs Creation of On-Site Treatment Systems Affording Veterans Improvements and Numerous General Safety Enhancements Act

Let's think of those Capitol Hill "steps" as the ways we can help "Just a bill" one step at a time with the goals set out in the Legislative Guide Sheet.

STEP 1: "The Priority Goals" Display the VFW Priority Goal flyer containing the Priority Goals at every VFW Auxiliary event and make it available throughout the community to get the information out. Include the goals in Newspaper articles in your local paper, take the flyers to the local library for display. Make sure your Legislators in Congress know what they are and write letters, e-mails, personal contact to ask for support. Mention them at every VFW Auxiliary Meeting – make a fun game out of what they know by asking questions, make a word search, play jeopardy, or Wheel of Fortune with the goal main points......give small prizes of candy, etc.

STEP 2: Promote <u>Action Corps Weekly</u> and inform members and the community how they can receive this publication with the click of a few buttons by signing up from <u>www.vfwauxmi.org</u> (legislative program) Use copies of Action Corps Weekly with the flyers for the Priority Goals in the display you take to the library. Make sure you have a contact name on your display for more information.

STEP 3: Youth Education: Have you gathered materials you can take to school about the legislative process? There is a website www.classroomdoodles.com /branches-of-government.html that has coloring pages or just google Veterans or legislative coloring pages. Ask the school if you can hand out the coloring pages in classrooms or ask Scout Leaders if you can visit a meeting to help educate the children about Veterans and how the legislative process works.

Copy the **"I Vote in Honor of a Veteran"** sticker on heavy paper — you can get the pattern for the stickers on-line at the Department site: www.auxiliarymi.org — Copy them on thick paper, if you do them in black and white you could a youth group to Color them (glue pins or put sticky two sided tape on the back). Talk to them about Veteran Issues and how they can help our Veterans even though they can't vote by giving adults a sticker and reminding them to vote in honor of a veteran.

<u>STEP 4:</u> Contacting Legislators about Veteran Issues: "Use the Guide to Contacting Your Legislators" (you can find this on the Dept. website under Legislative Chairmanship), start by researching who your senators or representatives are by using this website: http://cogresslookup.com/ Plan how you will contact your Legislator and be prepared. Decide what form of contact you will have (in person, e-mail, regular letter) and take the time to actually do it. Visit local council meetings, school board meetings, any public setting you can share Veteran concerns.

Elections are coming up, make sure you get involved by offering to bring people to the polls, ask the VFW to co-sponsor "Meet the Candidates Night", hold voter registration drives. Please Read the VFW Auxiliary Involvement in Elections and Political Activities flyer on the Dept. website. You should not endorse candidates on behalf of the VFW Aux. as a Local, District, Dept. or National leader. The key is to stay informed on the issues and use your influence to urge new candidates and those up for reelection to support the VFW, VFW Auxiliary and Veteran issues. Be an example as a veteran supporter to show we are a strong group of voters that candidates want on their side.

<u>STEP 5:</u> Learn all you can about the Legislative chairmanship by attending a School of Instruction and attend your District Meetings to learn all you can about what is happening in your area and around the state and nation with the VFW Auxiliary – be informed.

STEP 6: REPORTING: Follow the simple guidelines in the guide sheet and **REPORT** at least once a quarter. I need to know <u>HOW</u> YOU DID IT....<u>HOW</u> MANY CONTACTS.....<u>HOW</u> YOU USED MATERIALS.....<u>HOW</u> YOU EDUCATED YOUTH.......<u>HOW</u> YOU PROMOTEDnot just that you did it.......<u>HOW YOU DID IT IS IMPORTANT!</u>

Take credit for **all your hours**, **all your miles**, Example: if you had 6 people working 2 hours on a project that is 12 hours – not 2 hours - also count the miles EACH ONE OF THE 6 PEOPLE TRAVELED to get there = TOTAL MILES.

One step at a time let's climb to the top of those Capitol Steps by doing our part to help make that "Veteran related bill" become a law. Remember: "United We Stand" because we "Believe....We Can Do It"
