Historian / Media Relations Chairman, we are now halfway through the 2024-2025 year. At this time, you should have awards, certificates, articles, photos and/or activity information collected for your Auxiliary 2024-2025 Auxiliary/President's Scrapbook. Remember one of the Goals under the Historian/Media Relations Program is making a Scrapbook for your Auxiliary President's Year. Now is the time to be reviewing the Historian Goals and checking off those that you have accomplished and planning on how to complete those not yet accomplished.

You should have by now reported attending a District Meeting and a District, Fall Conference, or Convention Historian School of Instruction in Quarter 1 and/or Quarter 2. Remember, every Auxiliary is required to attend every District Meeting, it is in the Bylaws. I understand many members are not savvy when it comes to technology. If you are not able to report for your program, remember anyone can report for your Auxiliary. You can even mail or email me a monthly or quarterly report. Location of the form to use can be found here: vfwauxmi.org > Resources > Downloadable Info > Misc. Forms > Quarterly Report Form. You need to report, to keep your Auxiliary's "Non-Profit" status.

Remember to brag about your Auxiliary's great deeds and promote your Auxiliary's work for our Veterans and their needs. Get the message out there by social media, Newsletters, Radio, TV, Community Activities, VFW Post and Auxiliary Activities, Flyers and distributed information. Remember to have Adult and Youth Photo Release Forms available for those in your Social Media Photos. You can find these forms at this location: vfwauxmi.org > Programs > Historian > Sample Photo Release Forms. Also, you do not use the last name of Youth in your articles. When putting the word out make sure you remember the 5-W's.

THE 5 - W's

1. Who Do You Contact:

- Contact Local Newspaper, have a reporter at the event or write an Event Press Release Article they can use with photos.
- Contact Local Radio Station, ask them to add it to their Community Calendar of Events. Write an Event Press Release Article they can use as a Community Activity.
- Contact Local TV Stations, see if they are willing to cover your event.

Contact your Historian or someone to be at your event to record what happens and take photos.

2. What is the Event:

- > VFW National Auxiliary President Visit.
- > Events hosted by the Auxiliary.
- > Participating in "Wreaths Across America".
- > Decorating or cleaning veteran gravesites.
- > POW/MIA Remembrance Ceremony.
- Assisting deployed troop's families.
- Scholarship events and honoring your winners.
- Buddy Poppy and Membership Drives.
- > Flag Presentations to Community Groups.
- > Working with Youth and Community Groups.

<u>Program Goals</u> Be an Advocate - Be Informed - Be Engaged

Do you believe it is the holiday season & so very close to a New Year? Neither can I!!

As I am writing this bulletin, we do not have the results of one of the most consequential general elections in our country's history. Regardless of the eventual outcome, we will have many new faces in Congress and it is our mission and duty to educate them on our VFW Priority Goals and the approximately 150 VFW supported bills currently pending. We are still pushing for The Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act as well as the Major Richard Star Act. Back on the forefront is S.2888 / H.R.3933, TAP Promotion Act. The House and Senate Committees on Armed Services are negotiating their versions of the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year 2025. This provision would require that accredited claims representatives such as service officers from VSOs such as the VFW and others, along with state and county service officers, are present in Transition Assistance Program (TAP) classes to support transitioning service members with filing pre-discharge claims. This would facilitate a warm hand-off from the Department of Defense to the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) for the benefits that veterans have earned and deserve. Ensuring veterans receive their VA benefits and health care as soon as they leave the military facilitates a smooth transition and can also reduce the risk of homelessness, food insecurity, and suicide.

Due to the VFW's advocacy efforts, VA started incorporating accredited service officers into its TAP classes in early 2024. This is a great first step, but passing the TAP Promotion Act would establish this as a permanent program. Fortunately, since this is a current VA practice, codifying it into law would require no additional funding from taxpayers. So, get those letters and emails out to your U.S. Senators and Congressmen ASAP!

Keep up the good work on promoting our **VFW Priority Goals**, responding to the **Action Alerts** and signing up members for the **VFW Action Corps Weekly**. Visit www.vfw.org/advocacy/grassroots to read and sign up. Please let me know if you need any assistance in the sign-up process. And don't forget to report the number of members who are actually signed up for the Action Corps Weekly. Based on your reporting, you are all doing an exceptional job!

I wanted to share some background on the VFW National Legislative Service. They establish the VFW's legislative priorities and advocates on veterans' behalf. By testifying at congressional committee hearings and interacting with congressional members, the VFW has played an instrumental role in nearly every piece of veterans' legislation passed since the beginning of the 20th century. Everything we do on Capitol Hill is with the VFW's Priority Goals and veterans' well-being in mind. With the strength of the more than 1.4 million members of the VFW and its Auxiliary, our voice on Capitol Hill cannot be ignored! Among the VFW's most recent and important legislative victories was expanding college education benefits for military service members with the signing of the Forever GI Bill and ensuring America's service members and veterans receive the care they deserve - whenever and wherever they need it - by passing the VA MISSION Act.

In closing, please review and keep in mind your Achievement Goals when reporting. Keep in mind the National and Department Awards for collaborating with the VFW Post connecting members with local lawmakers. The entry form is in Malta/Member Resources and due to me by March 31. Please don't hesitate to contact me if you have any questions. Thank you for your continued efforts on behalf of our Veterans and their families.

Also, a **CORRECTION**, at Fall Conference I said submissions should go to the District level first and I was incorrect. Please submit your winning submission for each grade range directly to me.

Camp Trotter:

I have received many questions about where to send donations for Camp Trotter. You can go to camptrotter.org, click the donate button and submit there OR you can mail a check to Dept of VFW MI, Attn: Camp Trotter, 924 N Washington Ave, Lansing, MI 48906. Be sure to note what your donation is for in the memo line of the check. Acceptable memos are "Scholarship Fund", "Life Membership", "Camp Trotter", or "Camper Name." If the

memo line is not used it will go directly to the general fund and be used for general operating expenses.

2025 Pool Program

- 1. Districts that have Auxiliaries with pool teams should appoint a Chairman.
- 2. Permission must be given by the Auxiliary floor to use the Auxiliary number.
- 3. We will follow the rules set in the State VFW Auxiliary Women's Division Pool Rulebook.
- 4. The tournament is held once a year, usually the third weekend in March.
- 5. Participants must present current membership card and be a member of that Auxiliary or VFW by January 1^{st} of the year the tournament is being held.
- 6. The host Auxiliary will furnish $\frac{1}{2}$ of the cost of the pool tables, the facilities, and the cost to hold the tournament and banquet.
- 7. Districts with 9 teams or less are allowed up to 5 teams. You may send 5 Singles and 5 Doubles for the first team entered and 1 of each for each additional team entered.
- 8. Two Auxiliaries may join together to form a team. You must decide which Auxiliary number you will use. A minimum of six ladies are needed to form a team.
- 9. You may enter just the Singles and Doubles if you do not have enough ladies to form a team.
- 10. The Singles and Doubles Champions from the previous year are automatically invited back to defend their title, at no charge.
- 11. The State Referees will play in the Singles event for no charge. They must referee all three days. One other person who is not already a referee must be designated as a substitute referee if we need them (according to a motion made on the floor at the 2017 meeting).
- 12. The tournament is self-supported by the entry fees. The fees go to purchase trophies, prizes, and staff expenses.
- 13. We make a donation every year to a project. This year it will be President Jane's Project which is Fisher House Foundation.
- 14. Any money raised by an individual Auxiliary Pool League will report it and have the books audited, just like any other chairmanship. You may request your money from your Auxiliary or District at any time.
- 15. We plan to promote sportsmanship, renew old friendships, and make new ones.
