OCTOBER DATES TO REMEMBER

13th- 1775 – The continental Congress established the Continental Navy (predecessor of the United States Navy-1792) – In Washington, D.C.

14th - Columbus Day - A day of observance in which the arrival of Christopher Columbus arrived in the America in the Bahamas in 1492

27th- Navy Day - A day to celebrate the achievements and sacrifices and contributions of the U.S. Navy and to recognize those men and women who serve in the Navy.

When someone thinks of November, usually we think of Turkey, family gatherings, football and leftovers. All those are good things but this month also brings Veteran's Day on November 11 of every year. This day is set aside to publicly honor and commemorate the living Veterans. Originally called "Armistice Day" it was established in 1926 by a



congressional resolution. Twelve years later it was changed by another resolution to become a National Holiday. In 1954 President, Dwight D. Eisenhower signed a bill proclaiming November 11 as Veteran's Day, but in 1968 a law was passed to establish the fourth Monday in October as the day to honor Veteran's Day. This change bothered many Americans and it was eventually changed in 1978 back to the original November 11th date for good. But truly we should be honoring all our Military personnel past and present all year long, not just at special times because a calendar says so.

If you are going to have some dinner or recognition at your post home why not make up a poster with this information on other lesser-known military holidays or birthdays and as people wander around and visit or are in line for food, they will be able to be "educated" on these. And you guessed it, it also counts for a goal on your guide sheet.

Auxiliaries, Districts, Departments and National have all completed their elections, installations and had their official first meetings under the newly elected officers. Let the 2024 – 2025 year begin. All the Historian/Media Relations Chairmen should be now collecting photos, copies of news articles about the Auxiliary, information about Auxiliary events and activities that **you have done** so far, this 2024 – 2025 year. The information collected should have been or should be shared on social media, put in the Auxiliary Historian Books, put in your newsletters and emails to members and in local newspapers. Brag about what you do for veterans and the community. Get

started collecting now and file the information so you don't have to hunt it down when you need it, like for your Historian Book or for Department and National Awards you will be applying for. The Auxiliary is a TEAM so ask others for photos and information they may have from the activities and events they attended.





Sharing all you do helps you to be part of your community. Showing what **you can do**, working with them, helping with community events (Outreach) and reaching out to veterans and their families (Veteran and Family Support) in the community to help with their needs are great examples. You have a lot to offer youth (Youth Activities), donating funds for education (Voice of Democracy, Patriot's Pen) and other contest awards (Scholarships), involving

them in patriotic events and learning about America and the American flag (Americanism). Share going into hospitals to volunteer (Hospital) and what you do for the veterans there. Draw attention to the legislative process (Legislation), Priority Goals and promote legislation for veteran's needs.

Remember to share events and activities you <u>will be doing.</u> Right now, you should be promoting the Post and Auxiliary Voice of Democracy, Patriot's Pen and Teacher of the Year programs. Show how community youth can benefit from the great scholarships offered, the patriotic thought process writing the essays, and the Auxiliary giving back to the community. By promoting upcoming activities and events to your community, you

provide an opportunity for the community to join you promoting patriotism, working with veterans at care facilities or hospitals, providing meals to veterans, helping or enjoying youth activities and joining you for social events at your VFW Post. This also provides opportunities to recruit (Membership) those who are eligible to join.

What Will You Be Doing?

You work the Programs in all your activities. So, get out there and share what you have done, what you can do and what you will do.

Another way to get your message out is by using the resources available to you. Learn the names of reporters who cover stories like yours and collect a list of media contacts. Send information to these contacts on a regular basis so they become familiar with you and look forward to your activities. You can send photos and information to your contacts if they are unable to attend your events. Your contacts can be in newspapers, radio, Facebook, community newsletters, social groups, schools and churches. Consider these questions when getting in touch with your contacts.

- ✓ Does it involve local people?
- ✓ Does it interest non-members?
- ✓ Does it help the community?
- ✓ Is it unique and new?

The holidays will soon be here. Are you saving toilet paper tubes to turn into treats for our veterans who are in VA, non-VA or nursing homes? The tubes are good for putting soft candy in for our veterans. Since some veterans are diabetic, when wrapping the tubes with gift wrap, indicate if the candy is sugar free. Attach a label with your Auxiliary number and location. Set aside a day or evening when you can do this with your Auxiliary members and invite youth groups to help.

Along with this team building, the wrapping party would be a good way to talk about the joys of volunteering, and recruit new members to come along when you distribute the candy-filled tubes. There are many ways of volunteering.

When you take a position, especially as a volunteer, it is said at that time you need to think about finding your replacement or at least another volunteer. What have you or your Auxiliary done to recruit new hospital volunteers within your Auxiliary or with youth groups in your area? Check with your local high school, as the guidance counselors may be looking for opportunities for their students who need volunteer hours. Hospital volunteering is not just about accumulating hours for awards; it is about bringing joy and smiles to our veterans. Talk to them, ask their first name, what branch of service they were in, do they have a favorite story about their time in the **military** to share, etc.

<u>Regularly Scheduled Volunteers</u> are individuals who participate in the VAVS program on a regularly scheduled assignment under VA supervision. There is a process at the VA to become a RS volunteer with background screening and orientation.

<u>Occasional/Episodic Volunteers</u> are those individuals serving under the VAVS program but don't meet the requirements of RS volunteers. These individuals frequently volunteer with a group or organization on an occasional basis.

<u>Student Volunteers</u> are under the age of 18 and must have parental or guardian approval to participate in the VAVS program.

More information on volunteering can be found in MALTA under Hospital Resources.

<u>Program Goals</u> Be an Advocate - Be Informed - Be Engaged

Where has this summer gone? The kids are back in school, football season is here and Halloween & Thanksgiving are just around the corner. This also means that our present sitting Congress will recess at the end of this year. Keep current and promote our pending legislation. The Senator Elizabeth Dole 21st Century Veterans Healthcare and Benefits Improvement Act, which would expand the caregiver program to those who serve our nation's veterans, is at the top of the list. We also still have H.R. 1282 / S. 344, the Major Richard Star Act, either as a standalone bill or as an amendment in the National Defense Authorization Act for 2024. Over 50,000 medically retired combat veterans with less than twenty years of service are required to forfeit every dollar of their Department of Defense retirement pay for every dollar they receive in Department of Veterans Affairs service-connected disability compensation. This extremely unjust offset must be eliminated. Please continue to contact your Legislators to get these important pieces of legislation passed before Congress recesses.



Get Out The Vote: This November is an extremely important election for our country and our democracy, not only the presidential election but also the congressional and state races that are going on. Please make sure you research the candidates to determine who will best represent our military and veterans issues. So how do we do this? Simply put, we **EDUCATE** - educate ourselves, educate others, especially our candidates, and then get involved in the voting process!

Remember who sacrificed to give you the right to vote - it is your responsibility to exercise that right!

Please report any interaction you may have with your candidates. Remember - as an Auxiliary member, we are non-partisan. As an individual, you may campaign or support any candidate you choose but not as a representative of the VFW or Auxiliary. Don't forget to proudly wear your "I Vote in Honor of a US Veteran" sticker when you go in to vote! Remember, voting or working the polls are not reportable Legislative activities!



VFW Priority Goals: Don't forget our Priority Goals. Educate our candidates on our six areas of importance. Share our brochure with them and make sure you have them visible at your Post and any displays you may have. And don't forget to report any and all of your activities!

Happy Fall! I can smell pumpkin spice and burning leaves.

BIG ANNOUNCEMENT: Congratulations to our 2024 Department 2-D Patriotic Art Winner Ana Bruck from Aux 3652 Decatur, who won 1st place at the National Level. She won a \$15,000 scholarship.

How are you "Aspiring to Inspire"? The current area of focus is the promotion of our scholarship programs. For high school students it is Voice of Democracy and Patriotic Art. For the middle school, it is Patriot's Pen. These programs are not just for the chairman to promote. Everyone knows either a student, youth group or a school that can participate.

Things you can do to promote:

- Make up postcards with links to all our scholarships and hand them out to people at church, the grocery store or anywhere.
- Go on the schools' websites and find teachers that teach English, Social Studies, Civics,
 Government or the Student Government Club. Send them the information for the PP or
 VOD. Find art teachers for the Patriotic Art at high schools or tech centers. For Illustrating
 America, contact teachers at elementary and middle schools. Follow up with contacts to
 the superintendent, principals, secretaries, and counselors. The more people hear of them
 the better.
- While you are in contact at the schools don't forget to mention and seek names for the Teacher of the Year contest. Many of our teachers deserve recognition.
- Does your town have a community Facebook page? Put a post on it about our programs and scholarships.

This is a great time of year to hold a fundraiser event or activity to raise money for your Scholarship fund. That money can go towards awards and a recognition event. Some ideas are a bake-less bake sale, craft show, 50/50 at an event, or change canister at your canteen marked coins for kids.

Voice of Democracy, Patriot's Pen and Teacher of the Year entries are due to your post by October 31, 2024. Local post judging needs to be completed and the post winner(s) sent to the district chairman by November 15, 2024.

REMEMBER all entries must include:

- VOD: Completed application, a USB with the recorded speech, a paper copy of the speech, a Student Bio form, a School Release form, and a wallet sized photo.
- PP: Completed application, a paper copy of the speech, a Student Bio form, a School Release form, and a wallet sized photo.
- TOY: Completed form, resume (teacher bio and why they are being submitted) other supporting documents and a wallet sized photo.

Once again, this year the Department will be uploading the winner information into the ScholarApp program for you, so no worries there. We just need all the above documentation. PLEASE also send to your District chairman the number of entries you had in each contest, the number of winners, how much you spend on awards and how much you spent on other recognition (meal).

Did you attend the Fall Conference, and/or School of Instruction? REPORT it. Did you attend your District meetings or District school of instruction? REPORT it. Did you promote each of the scholarships? REPORT it. Did you do any fundraising or provide funding for the scholarships? REPORT it. Did you share our scholarships with your community? Did you ask any community leadership to come and speak at your awards ceremony? REPORT it.

Thank you for supporting our programs but most importantly our students. Looking forward to hearing and reading all the District winner entries in December.

Operation Enduring Freedom begins October 7, 2001 **Birth of our U.S. Navy** October 13, 1775





O is for October and **O** is also for *Operation Bottom Cover*. Operation Bottom Cover is our National President Brenda Bryant's Special Project for 2024-25. You and your Auxiliary are being asked to help with this often overlooked expense of diapers and wipes for the babies of our active military and veteran families. Auxiliaries that participate in this project by **reporting** their promotion and or fundraising, will get a chance to receive a Citation of Merit and \$10. Here are more than a few ways to help:

- Coordinate with and make a gift of diapers directly to a military base. If you don't
 have a contact at the base, reach out to your VFW VMS Chairman, maybe they
 can help.
- Host a diaper giveaway for veteran or military families at your Post.
- Your Auxiliary can donate directly to a veteran or military family with this need in your area.
- Don't forget the wipes. Maybe you can challenge the VFW for every box of diapers you deliver, they can throw in the wipes. Team Work.

When your Auxiliary helps with this project, it can be reported under Veterans & Family Support i.e. promoting or participating with disaster relief, military assistance, National Veterans Service, unmet needs or providing direct aid; just remember to mention Operation Bottom Cover. In the near future, a link will be shared with members where veteran and military families can apply for this type of assistance.


National Theme: From Our Roots to Our Branches Extending Service to Our Veterans
