

FROM OUR NATIONAL AMBASSADOR – DIANA RUSSEL-MILTON

Check out the blog on the MALTA website under Member Resources. In Ambassador Diana's Blogs, she reminds us to work with schools and other groups to teach the kids proper flag etiquette. Teaching kids builds a commitment in them to show their pride in America and what great things they have by the sacrifices that our veterans have made. There are many tools available on MALTA to help members promote patriotism and Americanism.

REPORTING

We just completed the third quarter reporting period on January 31, 2026. Thank you for all of the wonderful reports that you are sending in. All of the Auxiliaries are doing a fantastic job promoting the program and working in their communities to light the American spirit. Great job. If you have anything that you haven't reported from prior quarters, it's not too late. You can still submit it. Just put activity date as the date you are reporting and put the actual activity date in the description. Time flies - we only have a couple months left of this reporting year. Check your Guide Sheets to see what you might be missing.

NATIONAL AWARD FOR AUXILIARIES

This award is for the most outstanding activity and/or event displaying or educating others about the proper ways to display and respect the American flag. The form is available on the Department website (vfwauxmi.org) and on MALTA under the Americanism program under Member Resources. **You must have the form to me via email or regular mail by March 31, 2026.**

HOLIDAYS & OBSERVANCES

February 1 – National Freedom Day – On this day in 1865, President Lincoln signed a joint House and Senate resolution which later became the 13th Amendment to the Constitution outlawing slavery. This day celebrates the end of slavery and recognizes America as a symbol of liberty. National Freedom Day was established by President Truman on June 30, 1948.

National G.I. Joe Day – G.I. Joe was created as a cartoon on June 17, 1942 by former Army Sergeant David Breger. The action figure was released in 1964 to represent heroism.

February 3 – Four Chaplains Day – In 1943, the *SS Dorchester* was torpedoed by a German submarine and as it sank, the four chaplains assisted civilians and military personnel onto lifeboats and gave up their own life jackets to save others. They were awarded the Purple Heart.

February 12 – Abraham Lincoln’s Birthday – Also known as Lincoln’s Day it commemorates the birth of our 16th President and the role he played in the end of slavery and leadership during the Civil War.

February 15 – Susan B. Anthony Day – Although not a national holiday, this day is observed as remembrance of the work she did to establish women’s right to vote. Unfortunately, she died in 1906 – 14 yrs prior to the ratification of the 19th Amendment to the Constitution.

February 16 – Presidents Day/Washington’s Birthday – Became a federal holiday in 1879 to celebrate our Founding Father and first U.S. President’s birthday which was actually February 22nd. It was moved to the third Monday in February in 1968 as part of the Uniform Monday Holiday Act. It is also intended to honor all American Presidents.

February 19 – Iwo Jima Day – commemorates the Battle of Iwo Jima and the successful capture of the Japanese island during WWII. The image of six Marines raising the American flag has stood as a legacy of patriotism and Americanism.

U.S. Coast Guard Reserve Birthday – The Coast Guard Reserve was established 1941 and will celebrate it’s 85th birthday. It was modeled after the Naval Reserve. After WWII, these reservists performed coastal patrols and port security work.

February 8-14 – National Salute to Veteran Patients Week – Established in 1978 by the Veterans’ Administration, the week is dedicated to veterans in VA hospitals and facilities to honor and thank them for their service.

March 1 – Asiatic Fleet Memorial Day – Established in 2002 by President George W. Bush, this day serves as a memorial to the naval veterans who lost their lives in 1942 as the *U.S.S. Houston* – a part of the Asiatic Fleet was sunk during WWII defending against the Japanese fleet.

March 3 – National Anthem Day – Francis Scott Key wrote the poem that was standardized by John Philip Sousa which became The Star-Spangled Banner which was first performed on December 5, 1917. However, it did not become our National Anthem until President Herbert Hoover signed it into law in 1931.

Naval Reserve Birthday – Established by Congress in 1915. By WWII, the Naval Reserve Force made up 84% of the U.S. Navy’s fighting force. It was renamed the Navy Reserve in 2005.

March 4 – Hug a G.I. Day – Founded in 1996 as a way to show appreciation and support for military personnel, both active and retired.

March 13 – National K-9 Veterans Day – Serves to mark the establishment of the U.S. Army's War Dog Program in 1942 which officially recognized dogs as part of the military. It honors military working dogs who have served alongside U.S Armed Forces since WWI.

March 16 – Robert Goddard Day – Honors physicist, Robert Goddard, who successfully launched the first liquid-fuel powered rocket in 1926. He is considered the father of modern rocketry and space exploration. His work and inventions laid the groundwork for space exploration and, therefore, the U.S. Space Force.

March 18 – National Supreme Sacrifice Day – Established in 2004 to honor those who gave their lives for the safety and freedom of others. It has been expanded to include emergency responders as well as military personnel.

March 21 – Rosie the Riveter Day – Established by Congress in 2017, this date honors the women who took up their patriotic duty in the work force to support the WWII war effort. For the first time ever, there were more than 19 million women in the work force working in factories for heavy artillery and steel mills.

March 25 – National Medal of Honor Day – First celebrated in 1991 having been signed into law and established by President George H. W. Bush. The Medal of Honor is the highest military award for valor and was created in 1861 to honor the heroism and sacrifice displayed by members of the military. The date commemorates the presentation of the first Medals of Honor in 1863 to six members of the "Andrews Raiders" during the Civil War.

March 29 – National Vietnam War Veterans Day – On this date in 1973, the last troops left Vietnam and the Military Assistance Command was disbanded. President Obama proclaimed March 29th a day to recognize those who served in Vietnam on the 50th Anniversary of the Vietnam War in 2012. It was signed into law by President Trump on March 28, 2017.

March 1-7 – National Invest in Veterans Week – Dedicated to honoring veteran entrepreneurs and their contributions to global economy through mentoring and funding opportunities.

What is Auxiliary Community Outreach?

Auxiliary Community Outreach is volunteer work performed by an Auxiliary under the direction of another organization, for the benefit of their community or its institutions. It is a donation of time, not in-kind or monetary donations. It's about partnering with other organizations in our communities to help improve where we live.

Auxiliary Community Outreach can:

- Be performed by people of any age, skill set or ability level.
- Benefit any group of people such as youth, senior citizens and those with disabilities.
- Benefit animals, the environment and public spaces.
- Be done in communities of all types and sizes – rural, suburban and urban, small and large. What's Considered Auxiliary Community Outreach Examples include:
 - Working walks or runs that benefit other organizations as an event spotter, water station volunteer, timekeeper, etc. (Walking or running in the race is not part of Auxiliary Community Outreach; that's participation, not partnering.)
 - Working with local police on child ID kits or with EMTs to host CPR Training.
 - Working with firefighters on fire safety and prevention.
 - Working with parks and recreation departments to plant trees, develop non-veteran related community art installations and on adopt-a-park initiatives.
 - Helping with a spay and neuter animal clinic. • Handing out food at soup kitchens.
 - Reach out to local groups and organizations to see how your Auxiliary can be of assistance.

Reminder: Chief of Staff National Awards

If you'd like to nominate someone for one of this year's two National Awards, now's your chance. Any Auxiliary or member can nominate a fellow member or a District President. You'll need to fill out the official entry form, which you can find in the MALTA Member Resources.

Please make sure your form reaches me by March 31, 2026.



1. National Awards for Members

Citation and a \$25 VFW Store gift certificate to one member in each of the 10 Program Divisions for the best assistance to the Chief of Staff in establishing a new VFW Auxiliary with the approval of the Department President.

2. Awards for District Presidents or Official Representatives

Citation and a \$25 VFW Store gift certificate to one District President or Official Representative in each of the 10 Program Divisions for the best assistance to the Chief of Staff with a struggling VFW Auxiliary by mentoring and maintaining a close relationship until the VFW Auxiliary becomes healthy, with the approval of the Department President. Use of MALTA Healthy Auxiliary tools and mentor training is required.

Mentoring and Performance Improvement Plans (PIP): This year, our mentors and Auxiliaries have a new resource to help them tackle challenges. As Karlene Beams, National Extension & Revitalization Ambassador, explains on her blog, the PIP was designed so Auxiliaries can take the lead in figuring out how, who, and when to address their own problems. When Auxiliaries take charge of their improvement process, they're more likely to solve issues and stick with the changes that help them stay healthy. What's especially helpful about the PIP is that it kicks in during the "yellow flag" phase—before any suspension is on the table. That gives Auxiliaries a chance to work things out while keeping their operations running smoothly.

Extension: How many times do you travel to other cities in Michigan and the first thing you do is look to see if they have a VFW there? If they do, check with them to see if they also have an Auxiliary. If they don't then start talking fondly of the Auxiliary and letting them know all the wonderful things we do for veterans. If they sound interested, let me know and I can assist them with starting a new Auxiliary!

Show off what your Auxiliary is accomplishing! Did your group support the Voice of Democracy or Patriot's Pen contests this year? Are you involved in the VFW Auxiliary Patriotic Art or Illustrating America programs? These Youth and Scholarship activities are great opportunities to

spread the word about what we do. Share your efforts—let people in the community see how you're making a difference for both our youth and our veterans.

New Auxiliary Organizers: If you attended my training session at the Mid-Winter Conference, thank you for joining me! If you're currently an organizer and would like a copy of the PowerPoint text, just reach out—either by email or phone, using the contact information below—and I'll be happy to send it your way. And if you're interested in becoming an organizer, let me know! There are several VFWs across Michigan hoping to launch new Auxiliaries, and we'd really appreciate your help.

Healthy Auxiliary Resources: You'll find a ton of helpful materials for your Auxiliary on our national website, www.vfwauxiliary.org. Once you log in, head to the "Member Resources" section — it's packed with tools designed to make your work easier. One standout is the Healthy Communication Phone/Text Tree. Good communication is the foundation of a strong Auxiliary, and this tool maps out exactly who should contact whom to share news fast and keep everyone in the loop. Plus, it encourages a personal touch by reaching out to members directly with a phone call or text.



You need to be promoting all the VFW Auxiliary Programs on social media so members and the community can be aware of the many activities we are doing to help our veterans, youth and community. Remember to always attach the hashtag #AuxiliariesinAction to your Social Media Reels. The Historian/Media Relations VFW Auxiliary National Award Form and Reel are also due March 31, 2026, to the Historian/Media Relations Department Chairman. The National Award is for the "Most Outstanding Social Media Reel Highlighting the VFW Auxiliary in Action." The form also qualifies your Auxiliary for the Department Auxiliary Award and the completion of the first goal on the Guide Sheet. Be sure to fill in that form and send it me. Your Reel of your "Auxiliary in Action" on social media is unique to your auxiliary and may be the one with the right touch!

1. **Find the Reel:** Locate the Reel you want to share
2. **Tap Share:** Tap the Share icon below or on the righthand side of the reel.
3. **Copy Link:** Select the Copy Link option.
4. **Send:** Paste the Link into an email and send it with the completed award form.

When you have activities that are benefiting our veterans, youth, scholarships or assisting a community organization you can promote them on social media along with other media platforms like newspapers, T.V., radio, flyers, magazines, newsletters, billboards and signs. Stay in contact with the people who can help you on

these platforms, so they know who you are and what your mission is for the veterans and community. Soon they will be reaching out to you when they have a project that would benefit your post or auxiliary. It becomes a partnership. If your contact is unable to attend your auxiliary event, you can send a Press Release to the contact. Print a copy of event photos and write up an article about the event (include the 5 W's) and send to your contact.

Before you contact anyone to cover an event your auxiliary is hosting or participating in, answer the following questions:

- Are local people involved?
- Is the event happening in the near future?
- Will non-members be interested in attending or hearing about the event?
- Will the event help the community? And how?
- Is the activity or event unique?
- Does the activity or event promote a new idea or concept?

Remember to report your reels, activities, and events you put on social media and other media platforms showing members and community your achievements. Place the information and photos in your 2025-2026 auxiliary scrapbook for memories, accomplishments, and ideas for future years. Post on the Historian/Media Relations-Michigan Facebook page to show your ideas and help other auxiliaries with new ideas.

Has your auxiliary reported your hospital work? There are about 1/3 of our Michigan auxiliaries who have not turned in one hospital report or even said they were reading the Hospital Bulletin at their meeting. You can let me know you are reading the Hospital Bulletin when you put the MASH code work in your report. The code word is always highlighted in bold letters and italicized.

VFW Auxiliary Hospital Program Guide: A helpful guide is available FREE on MALTA Website. If you, as Hospital Chairman, have not yet downloaded and printed out, do it now. It is a wealth of information. In it you will find information about reporting hospital work, hospital service pins and recognition awards. This leads us on to the next topic – Hospital Awards.

Hospital Awards: Now is the time to think about hospital awards, specifically, Outstanding Hospital Volunteer of the Year (Award No. 3), deadline this nomination is due to Department Hospital Chairman by March 31, 2026. Also, due March 31, 2026, is the Hospital Volunteer Recruiter Award No. 1 and No. 2. Copies of these nomination forms can be found on MALTA.

For more on Hospital Awards and Program Goals go to the (Program) Guide Sheet 2025-2026 where you will find the Membership Categories, Achievements, and Department Awards. If you can't find yours, let me know and I can email you a copy.

CONTINUING EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP

Each year, one (1) recipient will be selected from each of the four (4) VFW Auxiliary Conferences and will be awarded a \$1,250 scholarship to be used within the academic year following completion of the contest. The scholarship will be paid directly to the American college/university or vocational/technical school of the awardee's choice upon the completion of the scholarship activation requirements. The deadline for submission is February 15. The entries are sent directly to National. The entry forms are on the Department website. National President Lois Callahan's special project this year is the Continuing Education Scholarship. Donations can be made through Malta or send a check to National Headquarters earmarked National President's 2025-2026 Special Project

YOUNG AMERICAN PATRIOTIC ART CONTEST

The scholarships are: First place - \$15,000 Second place - \$7,500 Third place - \$3,500 Fourth place and Fifth place - \$1,500 Sixth place and Seventh place - \$1,000 Eighth place through Nineteenth place - \$500

- Students do not have to be related to a VFW or VFW Auxiliary member to participate.
- Students in grades 9-12 by March 31 deadline who are enrolled in a public, private, parochial or home school program in the United States, its territories and possessions, or dependents of U.S. military or civilian personnel in overseas schools.
- Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent resident (the application for which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen.
- Foreign exchange students, students aged 20 or older, GED and adult education students are not eligible.
- Previous winners of VFW Auxiliary National Young American Creative Patriotic Art Contests are not eligible.

3D DIMENSIONAL ART CONTEST

- Students in grades 9-12 by March 31 deadline who are enrolled in a public, private, parochial or home school program in the United States, its territories and possessions, or dependents of U.S.

military or civilian personnel in overseas schools.

- Although U.S. citizenship is not required, students must be lawful U.S. permanent residents or have applied for permanent resident (the application for which has not been denied) and intends to become a U.S. citizen.
- Foreign exchange students, students aged 20 or older, GED and adult education students are not eligible.
- Previous winners of VFW Auxiliary National 3-Dimensional Patriotic Art Contests are not eligible.

Both art contests entries are due to me by April 15. Send the art contest applications to your local schools or drop off at the library. Maybe your community center offers art classes or an art school.


How You Can Help Caregivers:

Mental Health Matters

Mental health challenges affect veterans of all eras. Experiences related to military service—such as trauma, loss, or long separations from family—can surface long after a veteran returns home. Depression, anxiety, PTSD, and substance misuse are real struggles, but **help and hope are available**.



Reducing stigma and encouraging open conversations about mental health is vital. When veterans feel safe asking for help, healing can begin.

How You Can Support Veteran Mental Health:

- Share information about local and national mental health resources
- Encourage veterans to seek professional help when needed
- Promote awareness programs and suicide prevention initiatives
- Be present—sometimes companionship is the first step toward healing

Your compassion and advocacy can help save lives.

Reintegration into Civilian Life

Transitioning from military to civilian life can be challenging. Veterans may face difficulties finding employment, adjusting to a different pace of life, reconnecting with family, or translating military skills into civilian careers.

Successful reintegration takes time, patience, and strong community support. The Auxiliary plays a critical role in helping veterans feel welcomed, understood, and empowered in this next chapter of life.

Ways to Support Reintegration:

- Assist with job fairs, resume workshops, and networking opportunities
- Support education and training initiatives for veterans
- Encourage participation in community and Auxiliary activities
- Foster environments where veterans feel a sense of belonging

Keep your eyes open for opportunities to award Youth with one of the Citations found on Malta and the Department website. Award the **Youth Acts of Kindness Citation** for Youth




