A heads up for every Auxiliary. Sec. 708 - National Dues as stated in the National Bylaws.

A. National dues shall be ten dollars (\$10.00) per annum on each member, effective July 1, 2024, Paid by ACH transaction to National Headquarters.

This is the time your auxiliary should be holding discussions about your Auxiliary yearly dues for your continuous members. Beginning July 1, 2024, your Auxiliary will be forwarding a total of \$17.00 per member to cover the \$10.00 National dues amount and the \$7.00 Department of Michigan dues amount. To fulfill your Auxiliary to do list. Can you keep your current dues at the same amount?

How are you planning to spend Valentine's Day? As a group of Auxiliary members maybe you can make plans to visit shut ins, or hospitalized local Veterans, and pick up their spirits by letting them know that they are not forgotten by giving them a Valentine's card.



Healthy Auxiliaries should continue to make use of the Tools on Malta, especially *Building on the Auxiliary Foundation*, and the Healthy Auxiliary Tool Kit.

There are National Awards coming soon. Read up on them on your Guide Sheet and on Malta.

Review of the Healthy Auxiliary checklist found on the Chief of Staff Program page:

REMEMBER

Healthy Auxiliaries have things in common:

- They hold a minimum of 10 meetings w/ a quorum per year
- Dues must be current for officers (by 12-31-2023)
- The offices of both President and Treasurer were bonded by 8-31-23
- The 990 report has been filed with the IRS by 11-15-23, and copy to the Department Office.
- They are always working to recruit new members and retain current members.
- There is representation at all District meetings since it is mandatory for EVERY Auxiliary at EVERY District meeting to be represented, per the By-Laws.
- Red Flags are ok. They mean a little attention is needed. Don't be afraid to speak of your worries. That's the only way we can help. Please do not wait until April elections to say anything. We also expect an honest evaluation from the District President on his/her Official Visit.

The following deadlines will be coming up quickly so get prepared:

- The next round of District meetings of the Auxiliary year will begin in February so plan to have representation at those meetings. Remember that it is a By-Law requirement.
- The next audit covering the months of October, November and December 2023 is to be held this month. It is to be approved by the Auxiliary and into the Department Office by the last day of February 2024.

I hope you attend all of the training at the Midwinter conference this month.

Extension and Revitalization Bulletin February 2024

The District meetings start back this month. Every Auxiliary is mandated to have representation at all District Meetings. Failure to accomplish this is a definite Auxiliary **RED FLAG**.

Consider making a gift of dues for a member who might be struggling and did not pay by December 31, 2023. Use your relief Fund or be a dues Angel. Remember that they are no longer **in good standing** and if dues are not submitted by June 30, 2024, they are no longer a member **AT ALL**. They must rejoin and establish their eligibility. All years of membership are lost and they are as a new member (years wise).

These will keep you up to date on what a Healthy Auxiliary does. If you missed any of these, it is not too late to accomplish them

There was much information shared by all of the Department Chairman at the Midwinter Conference. Hopefully you were there.

Elections are around the corner. Remember District Delegates need to be elected, as well as officers, and Department Delegates. Check your By-Laws for appropriate dates for these.

Reach out if your Auxiliary needs a bit of help or just has a question that they need answered. The Healthier we are, the more we can do for the Veterans and Communities.

- Video's on how to start Facebook and websites.
- Samples of Speeches

Did your Auxiliary DO or does your Auxiliary HAVE PLANS TO DO any of the following:

- Educate youth about the Pledge of Allegiance (in-person or through video conferencing)?
- Host a "Buddy"® Poppy Drive?
- Partner with another organization to better your community?
- Drop off items for hospitalized veterans at VA and non-VA medical facilities?
- Contact members of Congress regarding veterans' issues?
- Host food drives or donate food to a local food bank/food pantry?
- Donate gift cards so service members overseas can purchase items of their choice?
- Send Valentine cards to soldiers overseas or hospitalized veterans?
- Donate books to your local library, school, or literacy organization?

The last set of Bullet points we know members and Auxiliaries are doing, plan to do and have done, along with many other things not listed. It's so important for members to take photos and keep a record of the projects they work on at home or at an auxiliary activities/event.

The who, what, when where and why of an event is so important to the story – and history – of the VFW Auxiliary. Take pictures (and write down who is in them), keep newspaper articles or print out online news articles about what is going on in your community, your state, our country, and the world.

Don't forget to post on social media the wonderful things you are doing in the name of the organization.

Are you capturing your Auxiliary's history? If not, it is time to start.



Writing reports

Let us review. Legislative work is winning friends and influencing others to issues concerning our military, our veterans, and their families. How do we do this? By getting to know who are the people in Lansing and Washington DC. The people who pass bills (action for the government to do) based on their beliefs and influences made by individuals, organizations, companies, lobbyists. Are you sitting back and just trying to get by in life? Or do you believe that the government should be held accountable for some of the poorer decisions made in the past that have proven harmful to veterans? Like defoliants spread in southeast Asia. You could do that or something similar for Camp Trotter and National home memberships. Talk to your members and see what works for the majority who attend meetings.






