One of the goals on our Guide Sheet this year is to **plan or participate in projects or programs to support or recognize first responders.** There are a lot of opportunities this month, as well as next, to plan something if you have not already. The 20<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of 9-11 is this month, the first week of October is Fire Prevention week, and the 28<sup>th</sup> of October is National First Responders Day to name a few. Reach out to your local schools, police and fire departments, hospitals and see in what ways you can collaborate on an event in

your community or in your local schools. Remember, this is Community Outreach, meaning that you can host an event, but it must not be hosted at your Post home but rather somewhere out in your community. Remember to take pictures so you can add it to your Collage featuring your Auxiliary members volunteering with first responders (which is also a goal on your Guide Sheet).

### **How to report your volunteer time.**

When reporting your time, you will multiply the hours worked by the number of volunteers. So,  
5 members x 2 hours = 10 reportable hours.
